Bernstein's ballet music Fancy Free, is bold, brash and brassy, being the musical adventures of three sailors and two girls with another blonde too late for her date. The Ballet Theatre Orchestra conducted by Joseph Levine (Capitol CCL 7517) present the music without any inhibitions. The same company have also recorded Aaron Copland's ballet music, Rodeo (Capitol CCL 7516). Copland to Bernstein is as master to pupil, and the music sounds that way, with Copland's subtleties asking a little more of your listening.

Shostakovich's 100,000 roubles Piano Quintet -- it won a Stalin Prize in 1941 - is a different kettle of fish. The titles the movements-Prelude, Fugue, Scherzo, Intermezzo, Allegretto-suggest a classical background. The texture of the music has something of the flavour of Mendelssohn and a little of the 18th Century seen through a distorting mirror. How Russian this may be only Shostakovich and his critics may know. The music has the clarity of an etching, and despite the sprinkling of clichés is made very exciting by the Quintetto Chigiano (Decca LXT 2749).

Down in South America they do things a little differently, although the shadow of the 19th Century still seems to hang about. That prolific Brazilian, Heitor Villa-Lobos, is represented this month by some piano pieces played by Ellen Ballon (Decca LX 3075). The playing is most competent and the music is not at all as exotic as you might expect. It varies from something resembling a more virile Rachmaninoff to what sounds like Europeanised Brazilian folk idioms.

Coda

Finally, two discs a little off the beaten track. The first is a recital of Old Netherlands Music played on the organ of St. Jans Church, Gouda, by Flors Peeters (Nixa PLP, 239). The bril-(continued in next column)
