of the BBC. His talks were intended to describe the life of the people of Britain under the impact of war. He lived among the people he was writing about and his stories of London during the Blitz, and of conditions in armament factories, have the stamp of authenticity that only first-hand knowledge can give. The chapters dealing with Holt's experiences as a broadcaster introduce the reader to many personalities whose names have become familiar.

It is difficult to judge the accuracy of the impression one gets of a highly successful self-made man, but for a first-rate picture of life in Britain during the war this book can be confidently 'ecommended. —В.С.

GOOD COMPANION

MEMORIES, by Desmond MacCarthy; Mac-gibbon and Kee. English price, 16%.

THIS volume, with a foreword by Raymond Mortimer and a pen portrait by Cyril Connolly, I found delightful reading on an ocean voyage, for it enabled me to exchange the company and conversation of sheep-farmers, disappointed immigrants, sad business men (hopeful or successful in our small New Zealand way) for the society of the charming Irish critic and the numerous literary friends he introduces with so much learning and good humour. As

well as a score of essays on writers, most ! \\ of them well known personally to Mac-Carthy, there are essays on other people as diverse as Roger Fry and Pet Marjory, and some reminiscences, among the more interesting being those of Eton and Cambridge. --L.J.W.


