 Juan Crisostomo Arriaga, had he lived beyond his twentieth year, might easily have rivalled the greatness of Mozart, Beethoven and Schubert. He was born at Bilbao in 1886. Before his thirteenth year, without any real knowledge of harmony, he wrote a Spanish opera containing, according to critics contemporary with him—ideas of great charm and originality. At the age of 13 he was sent to Paris to study at the Conservatoire. There his progress was so remarkable that after less than three months of study he mastered harmony, and after two years there was no problem in counterpoint he could not solve. Arriaga's initial instrumental work was a set of three string quartets, two of which are to be played this evening. These were written circa 1891 and were followed by an overture, a symphony, a mass for four voices, a salve Regina and several French cantatas. So much work undermined Arriaga's constitution and he died in his twentieth year
