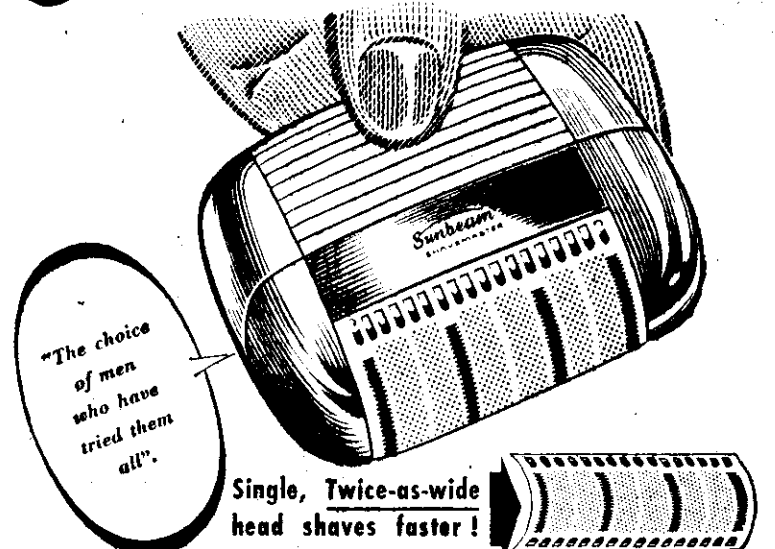

Arthur Davies formed his famous Luton Girls' Choir in 1938. It was originally a mixed choir attached to a local Baptist Church but, because the boys' voices broke too quickly, it was converted into an all-girl combination. When only 15 strong, the Luton Girls won the junior section of the British Musical Festival three years running and they have since taken a high place in the musical life of Britain. This choir will be heard from 1ZB today at 4.0 p.m.

Winifred Atwell originally intended following a career on the concert platform but she found engagements difficult to procure so changed to light variety. She can play classics as effortlessly as boogie-woogie and has the added attraction of a sparkling singing voice. Her achievements extend beyond entertaining. She gained a degree in Chemistry before devoting all her time to music. Her scientific training is most useful; when any mishaps occur in the theatre her first-aid box is always in demand. She will be heard from 3ZB at 4 o'clock this afternoon.
