IN ONE YEAR,680 New Zealanders were seriously burned in the home:

480 of these were under school age. For every person fatally hurt four others were permanently disabled.

NOT ONE OF THESE ACCIDENTS SHOULD HAVE HAPPENED

The causes were unguarded fires, radiators and hot stoves, and scalding from boiling liquids. • In cold weather keep your house warm, but also see that it is SAFE—

- · Keep your fires well guarded.
- See that pots and kettles cannot be pulled off the stove.
- Don't drink hot liquids while holding a baby.

Make sure that drugs, poisons, disinfectants and household cleansers are WELL LABELLED and OUT OF REACH of children.

POLISHED FLOORS and LOOSE RUGS can be dangerous, particularly to the elderly and to children.

Keep all sharp objects where toddlers cannot get them.
