It provides for Board and Longing, Tutton, School Books, Furniture, Bedding and House Linen.

The Extra Charges are: Washing, \$1 10s a year, and Medicine and Medical Attendance if required.

Students will provide their own wearing apparel, including the Scutage, so well as Surpitor for assistance in Choir.

The College re-opened on Saturday, February 14th.
The Seminary is under the Patronage and Direction of the
Archbishop and Bishops of New Zealand, and under the immediate
personal supervision of the Right Rev. Bishop of Dunedia.
