# ST. PATRICK AND ROME



CCORDING to the latest issue to hand of our South Australian contemporary, the Southern Cross, there is some likelihood that the controversy on the subject of the mission and teaching of St. Patrick which recently took place in the columns of the Register, and which was finally closured by the editor, may culminate in a public debate between the Anglican partisan and an able and scholarly priest of North Adelaide. Interestly interesting at the orbits of the columns of the colu

tensely interesting as the subject is, it is not one which lends itself very readily to popular debate—first, because it is largely, though not wholly, a question of authorities, and the average popular audience is hardly competent to judge either as to the historical value of the testimony adduced or as to whether the authors cited are being fairly and honestly quoted or are being garbled, misquoted, or multilated; and secondly, because there is always a tendency on the part of the anti-Catholic representative to narrow down the issue to a ridiculous extent and in such a way as to exclude nine-tenths of the available and valid evidence on the subject. If the issue is made sufficiently broad, so as to fairly cover the vital question as to the papal and Roman character of Patrick's mission and teaching, we have not a particle of doubt as to the Adelaide priest's
