
Longitudinal Concrete Sleeper.—A patent No. 2673 has been taken out by O. Valeri, Italy.—It consists of a sleeper of pentagonal section the smaller face of which rests on a ballast block, the longer upper face being provided with wooden cushions to which the rail is anchored.



The sleepers are connected by longitudinal ties b and transverse gauge bars f which are provided with adjustable rail grips.

Roofing Galvanised Iron without the use of Lead Headed Nails—A patent, No. 37,853, has been taken our by J. F. Johnson, plamber of 56 Bentley Street, Masterton which consists of a square of metal having two corners removed and raised beads running entirely around and parallel with the outer sides, the two upper beads any approved manner. The switch is formed by breaking away a short length of the main rail, and also a short portion of the length of the branch rail, such broken portions being disposed to extend from the point of junction. Two short lengths of rails adapted to respectively fit into the gaps in the main and branch rails are provided, and these are mounted on a horizontally moving bracket, and so disposed with relation to one another and the rails that when the bracket is moved across to one side the length to fill the gap in the branch will be in position is such gap so as to form a continuous line with the main, while the portion to fill the gap in the main line will be situated at a distance away therefrom and when the bracket is moved to the other side the positions will be reversed, the main line being complete and the branch broken.

Timber Colouring Artificially.--A patent, No. 37,434 has been taken cut by Ernest W. Carpenter, chairmaker of 454 Anderson's Bay Road, South Dunedin which consists of a solution of copperas and water heated, and then forced into the wood.

A difficulty has arisen over the recent Arbitration Award granting 2d, per hour war bonns to general labourers and carpenters. 


