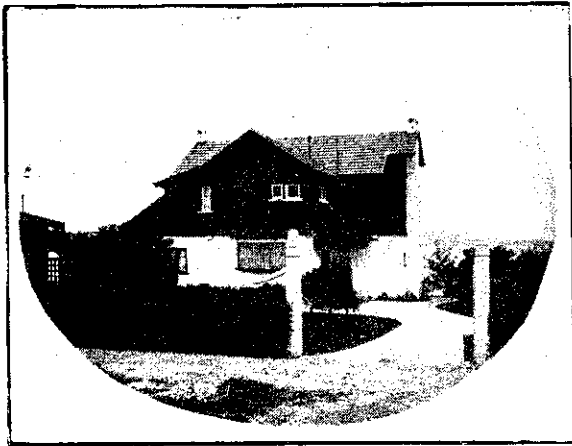

Two Auckland Residences.

Mr. G. L. Thorburn's House.

This home is situated on Burwood Crescent, Remuera, overlooking the Waitemata Harbour, and rests on a re-inforced concrete foundation. The walls are of stucco and shingles, and the roof is covered with Marseille tiles. Special attention has been given to the bathroom and kitchen appointments. The opportunity for entertaining a larger number of guests than is usually possible in a house of this size has been obtained by arranging the vestibule, living and dining rooms so that they can

of the house. An interesting treatment has been carried out in the dining-room which has a very finely panelled wainscotting of American birch; this



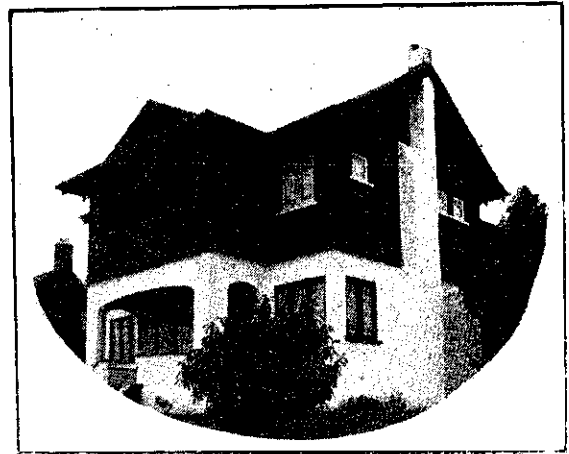
Residence for Mr. G. L. Thorburn, Auckland.

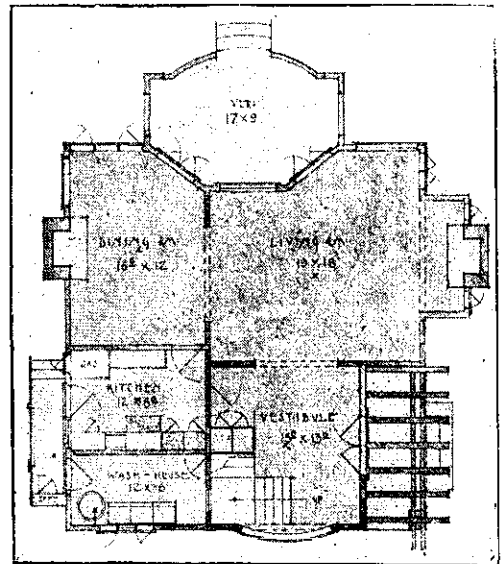
Mr. Chas. Court's House, Stanley Point, Auckland.

The main features are, a clear-storey reception hall and a billiard-room which will accommodate a full-size table and which also has a very comfortable ingle-nook. The house contains seventeen rooms, including accommodation for the staff, which is completely self-contained, and which can be separated at pleasure from the main portion
