trance is supported by five Gothic arches with columns and capitals. On the ground floor is the entrance lobby on each side of which is a parlour. From the main corridge two hights of stairs lead to the first floor. On the ground floor, on the left side of the corridor, is the science room, behind which is the commercial room off which is the children's dining room; on the right side of the corridor is the infrmary, bath-room, and layartry accommodation, behind which is the community room, a large kitchen, scuffery and pantry, and refectory. On the first floor there are 36 hedrooms, three bathrooms, two large rooms, and layarory accommodation. From the upstairs corridor a stair leads to the flat roof. The architect for the new building was Mr J. S. Gathrie, and the contractors were Messrs B. Moore and Son. It is estimated that the main building will cost about \$11,000.

Arrangements for the installation of the automatic telephone system in Caristchurch are well in hand. For a considerable time now the foundations have been down in Hereford street for the building, on the top starcy of which the Caristchurch Automatic Exchange will be located, the two ground floors being occupic by Post Office departments. This building is to be proceeded with straight away, and when it is completed the apparatus in the original Colonial Bank premises will be shifted to a suburban exchange.

The new technical buildings in connection with the Scattabridge District High School are nearing completion. Provision is being made for instruction in woodwork, science, agriculture, agricultural botany, agricultural coemistry, cativ science, domestic science, and handry work.

carry science, domestic science, and handry work.

The foundation stone of the Upper Ricearton Memorica was laid recently. The building, which is on a size in Ricearton road, facing Hansan's lane, will be of buick, and will take the place of the old Library in Hanson's lane. In any of the rooms will be placed a marble slab chronicling the names of the Ricearton lads who served in the war.

The foundation stone of the new offices for the Christcaurea Tramway Board, situated in the south-eastern corner of Cathedral square, was laid early this mouth by the Hoal John Barr, M.L.C., the chairman of the Boar L. The section was purchased for \$6000; the first estimate for the bailding was £18,722, subsequently increased by £660 owing to tacnecessity of putting in deeper and more secure foundations; when completed the total cost would be £19,000, or probably £20,000. The building for the Board's new offices and heer. designed by one of the Board's stuff, Mr H. T. W. McLennan. New Zealand stone was to be used the ground floor in Timaru stone (of which the foundation stone was an excellent example), and the first and second storeys of Oamara stone of approved quality. The foundations are strong enough to carry another storey should it be required in the future. The top storey of the building to be erected at present would be let to the Lytteiton Harbour Board for its offices.


