people who can write plays do not need to know any of the rules, and if a man can't write a play not all the handbooks that have ever been written will teach him. The born dramatist is one who doesn't know how it is done, but can do it. Sir James Barrie, when he was asked to write an introduction to the plays of Harold Chapin, confessed that he bought a book about how to write plays. But the book was so tearned and the author knew so much and the subject grew so difficult, that Sir James abandoned it in despair. And we may reflect upon how great would have been the loss to the English stage if Barrie had ever learned how to write for it.


