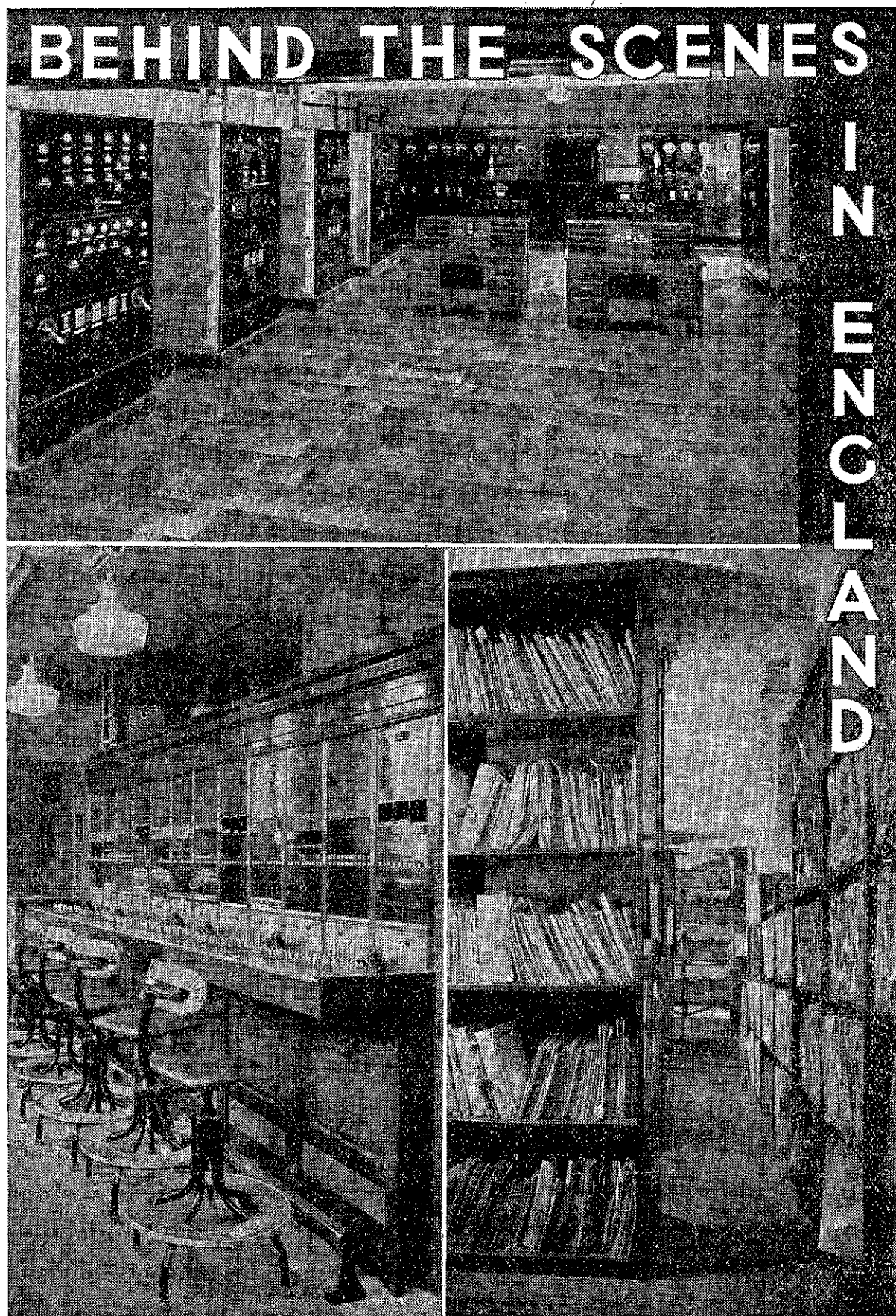




IN ENGLAND

At the top is a view of the transmitter hall at Daventry from which the Empire programmes are broadcast. On the left can be seen one of the 20 kilowatt transmitters with control panels in the centre. Bottom left is the private telephone exchange at Broadcasting House where more than 2000 calls are handled daily. There is also inter-communication between the head offices in London and the provincial studios.
