December 11, 7.30 to 8.30 p.m.—CP4, "Radio Illamini," Bolivian Radio Co., La Paz, Bolivia, 1040 k.c., 10 k.w.

December 12, 7 to 8 p.m.—CPX, "Radio Nacional," Casilla Correo 596, La Paz, Bolivia, 1220 k.c., 5 k.w. A special programme of rare native Inca music will be presented during this broadcast.

(All times given are N.Z. summer times.)
