1YA, SUNDAY, DECEMBER 16.

A relay from Albert Park of a concert by the Auckland Municipal Band, under the conductorship of Mr. George Buckley.

2YA, SUNDAY, DECEMBER 16.

A farewell pianoforte recital by Mr. Gordon Bryan, examiner for the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music.

3YA, SUNDAY, DECEMBER 16.

A studio presentation of the medieval morality play "Everyman" by a cast including Professor James Shelley, Marjorie Bassett, Harold Shaw, Professor Pocock, Elizabeth Wallwork, and other well-known Christchurch performers.
