GSB, 31.5m., R7, QSA5, 9.10 p.m. Scenes from Shakespeare.

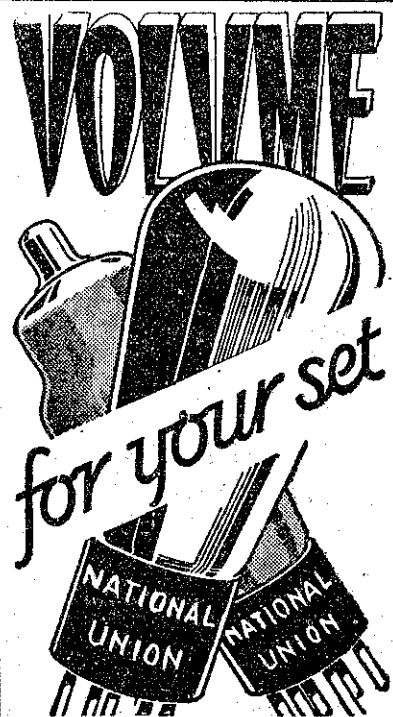
VK3LR, 31.3m., R7, QSA5, 9.14 p.m. Sports results.
