IN an article in an American paper, Stokowski, conductor of the Philadelphia Symphony Orchestra, regrets that "music comes from the radio in incomplete and changed form," because some of the harmonic or overtones are lost, and he hopes for new "high-fidelity" transmitters and receivers capable of frequencies of from 30 to 13,000 cycles.
