

## Fresh Adventures And Thrills In New Frankenstein Film

Universal's "Bride Of Frankenstein"

Foremost among Universal's list of talkies for early release in New Zealand is "The Bride of Frankenstein," a film which contains nearly all the thrills ever thought of. The stars are Boris Karloff and Elsa Lanchester, wife of Charles Laughton, and the actress who played the part of Anne of Cleves in "The Private Life of Henry the Eighth." Other big films from Universal include "Lady Tubbs," starring the inmitable Alice Brady, "Magnificent Obsession," with Irene Dunne, the girl who played a prominent part in "Popente" and "Sing Me a Love Song" a levich marical and actions. in "Roberta," and "Sing Me a Love Song," a lavish musical production.

The cast is an interesting one, Boris

Karloff, whose name is now synomyous with screen chills, plays the part of the monster again. Karloff is an Englishman who first became an actor with a small touring company in British Columbia. Later he toured the United States, being engaged by Universal to play the leading role in "Franken-stein" Since then he has played a number of important film roles in such pictures as "The House of Rothschild,"
"The Mummy" and "The Lost Patrol."
Elsa Lanchester, who plays the "bride" in this production, is the wife of Charles Laughton, probably one of the most important actors in the world to-Miss Lanchester began her stage career at the Children's Theatre, London, at the age of 16. Her first screen appearance was in the silent version of "The Constant Nymph." She has been in America for some months and has appeared in "Naughty Marietta" and "David Copperfield." Valerie Hobson and Colin Clive are two more well-known stars who appear in "The Bride of Frankenstein,"

### CHANGEOVER IN FILM PERSONNEL

### United Artists Secure Valuable Services

UNITED ARTISTS (AUSTRALA-SIA), LIMITED, have received cable advice from their New York óffice that Mr. A. Litchman has been made president in place of Mr. Joseph M. Schenck, who has resigned. Mr. David O. Selznick, the foremost producer for the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Corporation, has joined the United Artists team, and is to produce six pictures for the coming season.

Among David Selznick's outstanding productions have been "Dinner at Right," "David Copperfield," "Tale of Two Cities" and "Anna Karenina." The announcement of the changeover has caused rather a sensation in the film industry in America, and his alliance with United Artists is expected to maintain that distributing company's prominent position in the trade.

Other production activities under the United Artists' banner for the coming year include six pictures from Samuel Goldwyn: Merle Oberon in "The Dark Angel," Miriam Hopkins in "Barbary Coast," "Splendour," Eddie Cantor in "Dreamland," also "Goldwyn Follies" and "Navy Born."
