9.30: From the Palais Pictures. St. Kilda: A musical presentation by Harry Jacobs and his Palais Theatre Orchestra.

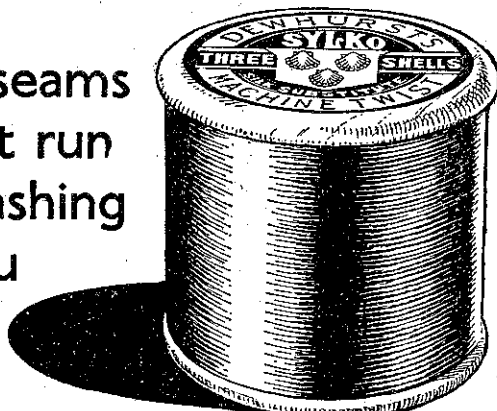
