REVOLVING loudspeaker, constantly emitting a warbling note as a motor whirls it upon its mounting, is aiding U.S. Bureau of Standards research workers to measure the effectiveness of sound-absorbing panels. The unusual device operates in such a way as to creat a uniform "sound pressure" in its vicinity, permitting panels of various types of materials to be exposed to a similar barrage of noise for a comparison of their performance.

f A MONG the most interesting jobs held by women in broadcasting is that of Eileen Foley, announcer and programme arranger of 9MI, the licensed broadcasting station on board the inter-State passenger liner, Kanimbla. Miss State passenger liner, kanimola, laiss Foley is the first woman in the world to conduct a shipboard radio station.
