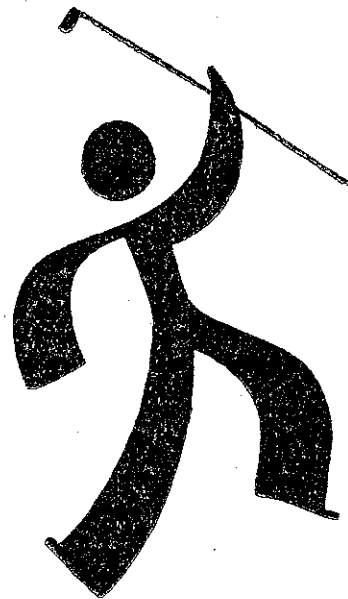

Radio Round The World

LITHUANIA recently called for tenders for the building of a first-class, high-powered radio station, to place broadcasting in that country on a new footing. The power is expected to be in the neighbourhood of 100 k.w.
