## Radio Round the World

ALEXANDER KIPNIS, the Russian basso, who opened his Australian tour in April at the Sydney Town Hall, has been a principal of the Chicago Opera House for a number of years, and has also given numerous recitals in the United States. He has just concluded an altogether novel tour of America. An enterprising enterpreneur had the happy inspiration of engaging five Wagnerian singerstenor, soprano, basso, contralto and baritone—in order to present concert programmes mes featuring Wagnerian Alexander Kipnis was the music. basso of this combination, which toured throughout the States as "The Wagnerian Festival Singers," and which was described by the New York "Musical Courier" as "the luminous quin-
