

TELEVISION

WATCHING THE ENGLISH SPORTS

FOR the first time the whole of a football match—the recent Calcutta Cup Rugby game between England and Scotland at Twickenham—has been televised by the BBC.

Three cameras, placed thirty feet from the ground, were used: one next to the box from which the sound commentary was given, and two opposite the respective twenty-five yard lines. It was thus possible to cover the whole field in plan views and in close-ups. Viewers were able to follow the game.

Permanent television booths have now been built in the West Stand on the Twickenham ground—a development that reflects the close attention the BBC is giving to the televising of important open-air sporting events. During recent weeks a women's international hockey match has been successfully projected from the famous cricket ground at Kennington Oval, London—a broadcast that has confirmed the technical possibility of televising cricket matches from London grounds.

The finish of this year's boat race between Oxford and Cambridge was seen in the programmes from Alexandra Palace. An animated chair enabled viewers to follow the progress of the boats during the first part of the race, and then a camera equipped with telephoto lens brought to viewers' screens the crews passing the winning post.

Other forthcoming events at which it is expected that the BBC's television cameras will be present include the Lawn Tennis Championships at Wimbledon and the final ties at Hurlingham for two noted polo trophies—the Whitney Cup and the Empire Cup.

All Wave

Artists in Australia
