Radio Round the World

THERE were over 1300 applicants for a recent vacancy for a broadcast announcer in South Africa. There were several candidates over 50 years of age, one being 71.

N addition to talks in the chief European languages, Arabic, and Hindustani, Italian stations are now broadcasting in Serbian, Greek, Turkish, Albanian, Chinese Rumanian, Japanese.

EDUCATIONAL broadcasts were begun three years aog in Finland, these being made possible by the generosity of nearly three thousand enthusiastic pedagogues, who presented their home receivers to the schools. These sets are now on their last legs, but the Government has come to the rescue by agleeing to defray two-thirds of the cost of supplying new and up-todate receiving equipment,
