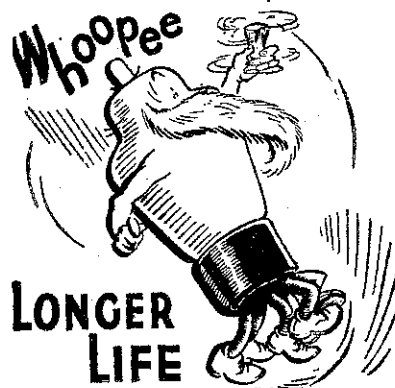

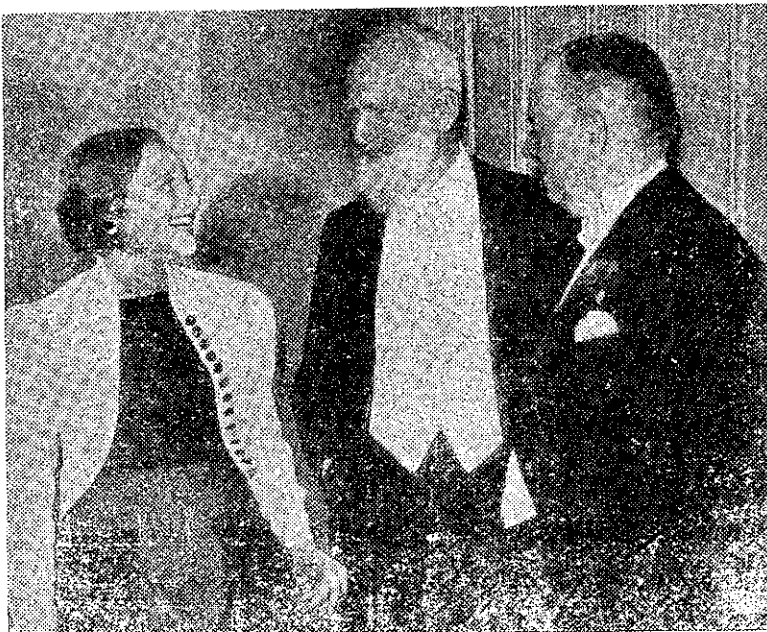

TWO OF THE SAME KIND

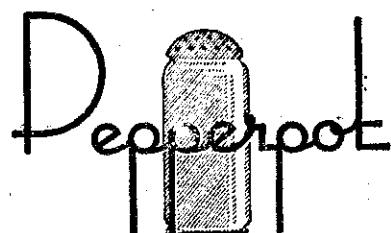
