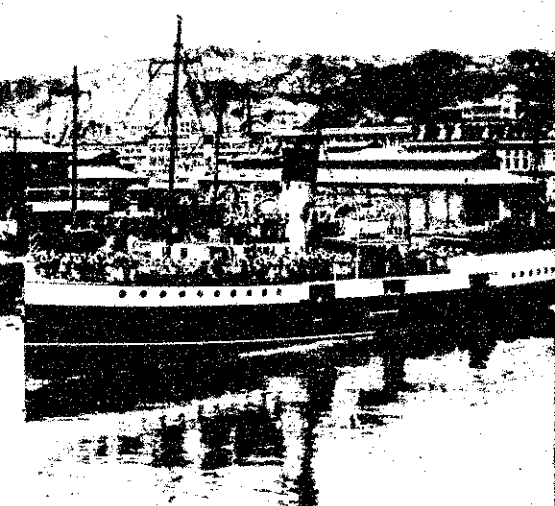
## EXCELLENT TRAM AND BUS SERVICES

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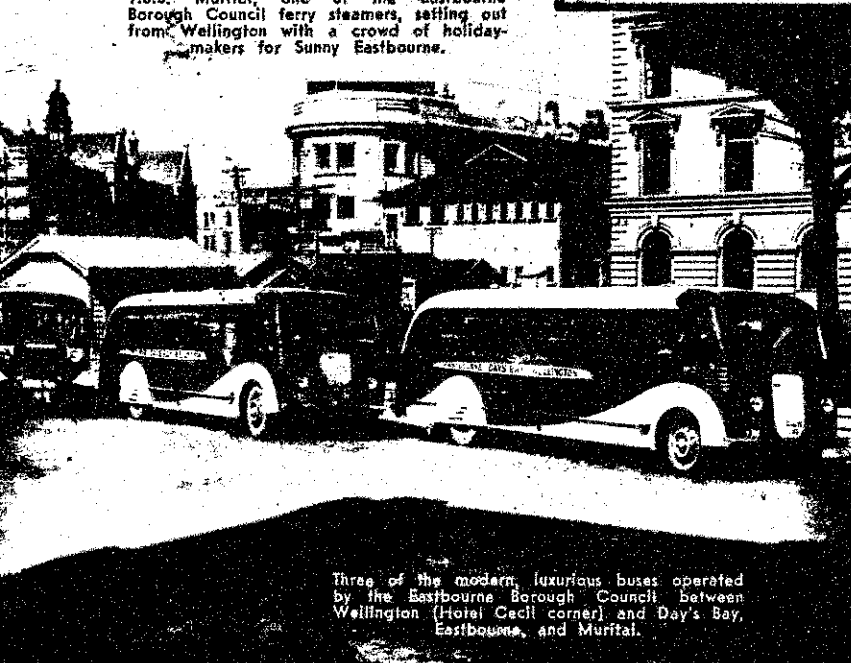
● The Wellington Tramways Department offers visitors splendid facilities for seeing the city. Apart from the tram service, which operates 31¼ miles of track linking the city with the outer suburbs, there is the Corporation Bus Tour, which provides a comprehensive survey of the Capital City and its surroundings. Buses leave from the Tramways Booking Office and Waiting Room, Post Office Square (opposite Queen's Wharf Gates), at 2 p.m. daily, including Sundays; 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. on public holidays. Seats may be booked for any day free of charge.
