This station rebroadcasts them on Wednesdays, Fridays, and Sundays, between 12.30 a.m. and 1.30 a.m., on 24 metres, and on Sundays and Mondays between 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., New Zealand standard time, on 48 metres.

All announcements are made in French, the call being "Ici Radio Maroc, station de l'office Cherigien." As an interval signal a metronome can The transmissions close be heard. down with the playing of "La Marseillaise."

JIAA, Japan.

THE shortwave station JIAA is located at Kemikawao-Cho, Chiba-Ken, Japan, and belongs to the Department of Communications. The wavelengths used are 38.07 metres and 19.036 metres. Directional aerials are used, directed to Europe and America. The aerial power is 5 kilowatts.


