

Wellington Notes

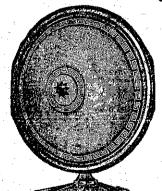
THE weekly talk for the man on the land will be broadcast by 2YA.
