Radio Exhibition Plans

THE first meeting of the new 1YA Musical and Dramatic Committee was held on Friday, April 10. There were present: Mr. A. B. Chappell (in chair—Dickens Fellowship), Mr. L. E. On the night of the municipal elections (May 6) the Rev. Jasper Calder will be taking charge of the programme, which will be filled-in with election results. On May 13, the 1YA Broadcasting Choir and the Orchestral Octet will be giving a night of old-time songs, etc., entitled "Dreams of Long Ago." From May 20 to 23 inclusive, there will be a Radio Exhibition in the concert chamber. Special programmes will be put on during that time on the stage, which will be fitted up as a model studio. The international programmes, featured at 2YA every Wednesday, were to be run at 1YA, and would start in May.

The committee again discussed the copyright question and the restrictions in regard to plays. The question of broadcasting controversial debates was also referred to.
