"From A to Z" is the title of the piece, comprising twenty-six selections from the works of well-known composers, arranged in alphabetical sequence. "A" stands for Abt, "B" for Beethoven, "C" for Chopin, "D" for Dvorak, and so on, the ultimate effect being a selection of classical origin, full of melodic continuity and with excellent harmonic effects. effects.

The orchestra will also present a selection, "The Voice of the Bells of St. Stephen's," a Viennese melody, and "Rozsa Czardas," a Hubay extract. This latter has plenty of work for the violin, is bright and cheery, and will be a welcome addition to the programme. The concluding item by the orchestra will be an Italian march, "Florentine," by the orchestral march-king, Fucik. Miss Myra Stokes and Mr. Gamble will present duets in addition to solos, one of which will be Rubinstein's "Wanderer's Night Song." The song chosen is a fine example of this composer's work. Mr. Satterthwaite's contributions will be "The Link Divine," by Piccolimini, "Nearer My God to Thee," by Carey, and "The Beautiful Prayer," by Gray.
