SUNDAY Items from 1YA

THE evening service conducted in St. David's Church will be relayed, the preacher being the Rev. Bower Black, of Christchurch, the newly-inducted minister, and the organist, Mr. E. S. Craston. The studio concert will be provided by the Salon Orchestra, Laetitia Parry (soprano) and Arthur Ripley (tenor). An interesting item will be a recital of "A Tale of Old Japan," by Zoe Bartley-Baxter, with incidental music by the orchestra.

Jottings from 2YA

THE evening service to be conducted in Trinity Methodist Church, Wellington South, will be relayed, the preacher being the Rev. T. W. Vealie, the organist Miss Lilian Thawley, L.A.B., and the choirmaster Mr. W. McLellan. Following this broadcast there will be a studio concert, provided by the Guild of Music Makers, comprising ten violins, four violas, four cellos, and two double bass. The Guild of Music Makers will play under the conductorship of John Bishop, who will himself play a group of pianoforte pieces. Keith Grant, the popular baritone, will sing a group of songs by Coleridge-Taylor and "Don Juan's Serenade," by Tschalkowsky.

Christchurch Notes

AT 2 p.m. will be broadcast a meeting of the "No More War Movement." The speakers will be the Rev. John A. Allan, M.A., Councillor Mrs. McCombs, Rev. W. Rowe, and Mr. C. H.

Cole. Members of the junior Peace League will sing national folk songs and give elocutionary items.

At 3 p.m. 3YA will broadcast items by massed bands and community singing from the Archery Lawn, Botanical Gardens.

Diamond Jubilee services at Oxford Terrace Baptist Church, Christchurch, will be broadcast at 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., the preacher on both occasions being Dr. J. J. North, with Mr. Vic. Peters as choir conductor and Mr. Melville Lawry at the organ. The after-church concert will feature Mr. and Mrs. F. W. Simpson in a piano and vocal recital, with introductory comments. The Melody Trio (violin, cello, and piano) will provide an instrumental programme.

4YA Selections

THE service to be conducted in St. Paul's Anglican Cathedral by Canon E. R. Nevill will be relayed. Mr. E. H. Heywood will be at the organ. A relay of 3YA's after-church concert will follow.

MONDAY From Wellington

THE subject of 2YA's "Musical Portrait," to be undertaken by Gordon Short (pianist) and Arthur Clark (tenor), is "Modern British Composers." Mr. Clark will include "Creation Song" from "The Immortal Hour," by Rutland Boughton, with whom he was associated in London, and a song of his own composition, "The Water

Lily." Amy Woodward (soprano) will sing "The Waltz Song" from "Romeo and Juliet," and two songs by Pearl Curran, "Dawn" and "Rain." Mrs. Wilfred Andrews (contralto) will be heard in a group of songs by Chopin, and the famous "Fierce Now the Flames Glow" from "Il Trovatore." The Orchestra, under Signor A. P. Truda, will play "Schubert's Sketch Book" and other tuneful numbers.

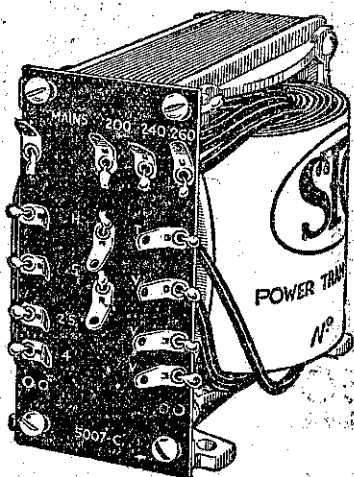
Auckland Topics
