SUNDAY

From 1YA

AT 10.55 a.m. a service conducted in the Unitarian Church will be broadcast. At 7 p.m. the anniversary services of the Salvation Army Citadel will be on the air, the preacher being Ensign Thorne. 1YA on the Air

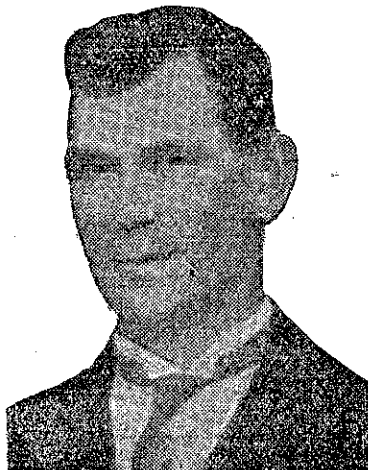
THE station will be on the air from noon to broadcast the results of the second day of the Takapuna Jockey Club's spring meeting.

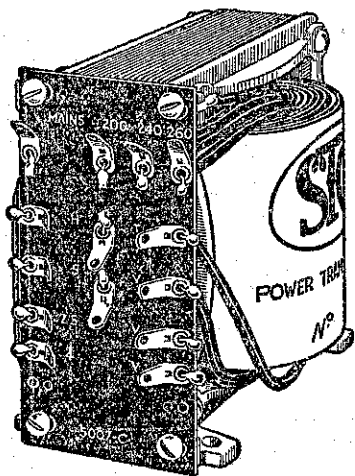
