Auckland Notes

THE evening service in St. David's Church will be broadcast, the Rev. W. Bower Black, LL.B., being the preacher, with Mr. E. C. Craston at the organ. The broadcast of a concert to be given in Albert Park by the Auckland Municipal Band will follow.

Wellington Features

AT 3 p.m. a relay will take place from the Town Hall, where there is to be a Salvation Army rally, at which General E. J. Higgins will speak on "Salvation Army Activities." The Hon. Sir Michael Myers will preside, and Lord and Lady Bledisloe will be present.

The local vocalists for the evening will be Anita Ledsham and Percy Nicholls. Mr. Nicholl's songs will include Sullivan's beautiful "Thou Art Passing Hence My Brother," and two operatic numbers, sung in Italian.

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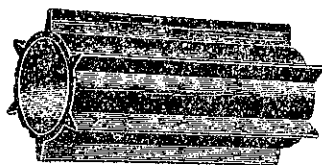
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
