At 9 o'clock there will be an entertaining interlude when Arthur Ross will talk on "The Origin of Popular Superstitions and Customs."

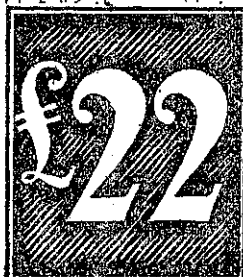
