Grahamstown residents are so keenly interested that they have signified their willingness to supply the necessary capital and request that all listeners within 100 miles be charged a license fee.

> OF the 35 million receiving sets installed in homes throughout the world, almost half are operated under licenses. The total population of countries where licenses are required is 370 millions, which is approximately three times the population of the U.S.A., yet the States have double the number of broadcasting stations that the "license" countries have.

London-Edinburgh express trains have been fitted for wireless reception.
