After September 24 we shall stop selling our penny packets and sell all the following lines in 2d. packets, the full size of the average 3d. packets: Cabbage, Cauliflower, Carrot, Celery, Pumpkin, Leek, Lettuce, Marrow, Onion, Parsnip, Radish, Beet (red or silver), Spinach, Turnip (swede or white), Antirrhinum, Aquilegia, Aster, Calliopsis, Canterbury Bells, Cornflower, Cosmos, Gaillardia, Godetia, Hollyhock, Larkspur, Marigold (African or French), Mignonette, Nasturtium, Nemesis, Petunia, Phlox, Poppy (Iceland or Shirley), Salvia, Scabious, Stock, Sweet Pea, Sweet William, Sunflower, Verbena, Viscaria, Wallflower. At present 1d. and 2d. a packet. Peas, Broad Beans, French Beans and Runner Beans are 3d. a packet.

SUNBEAM BROAD BEAN.

A broad bean with edible pods. Has the hardness of the broad bean and the tenderness of the French bean.

PERENNIAL CAULIFLOWER.

A most marvellous vegetable. Produces fifteen full-sized heads a year.

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A French bean with blue flowers, lavender leaves and dark blue pods. Most decorative in the garden and most delicious on the table.

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INDIAN PORCELAIN PLANT.

Striking annual. Produces an abundance of large, beautiful and highly-coloured fruit which, when dried, make most delightful vases.

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GIANT CABBAGE.

Weights up to 50lbs. Easily grown. Excellent for table.

SPINACH PLANT.

A small, hardy bush which produces, all the year round, a profuse crop of leaves tasting exactly like delicate spinach.

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A greatly improved and enlarged brand of salsify. Very easily grown. Is delicious with white sauce, and when in patties cannot be distinguished from real oyster.

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Runner Bean with pods up to 3 feet. Easily grown; excellent for table.

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SUNSHINE MELON.

A delicious rock melon so hardy that it has been grown successfully in Invercargill.

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Superb vegetable. Normally 3ft. long and 6in. thick, and always deliciously tender.

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A large, fine onion almost completely without odour; very hardy.

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SNAIL ROSE.

Delightful annual with masses of flowers exactly like roses. Snails, earwigs and slugs die as soon as they have eaten its foliage.

SUNSHINE CUCUMBER.

A new and enormously hardy and prolific cucumber that climbs fences like a runner bean.
