1. PICTURESQUE HERDS OR LIVE STOCK SCENES. We desire to make this a stronger section than hitherto, and particularly to bring out the wealth of the Dominion in beautiful herds and picturesque surroundings. Not only must the animals themselves be good, but care must be taken to secure suitable backgrounds of bush, trees, hedges, river or water views, in order to set off the herd, flock, or group of horses to advantage. Unsuitable backgrounds of wire fences, sheds, rails, vehicles, etc., must be avoided, as they may spoil an otherwise fine group. Special prize of £5/5/- for the best view; 2nd prize, £2/2/-; 3rd prize, £1/1/- Others used paid for.
2. STUDY OF HEADS OR GROUP OF HEADS. "Close-up" required of good animal heads: Bull, cow, calf, horse, pony or dog. £3/3/-. Three next best, each £1/1/-.
3. RIVER, LAKE OR SEASHORE SCENE, preferably with human interest in the foreground, but not essential. £2/2/-. Three next best, each 10/6.
4. STUDY IN VIRGIN BUSH, not necessarily an expansive view, but something close, intimate, and artistic. £2/2/-. Three next best, each 10/6.
5. CHILDREN AND THEIR PETS. This section is always a popular one, but a common error is neglect of a proper background. Charming studies have been spoiled in the past by lack of attention to this detail. With care the average picture of Childhood Pets can be wonderfully improved.
6. "BEAUTIFUL CHILDHOOD."—(a) Babies up to three (professional photos allowed)—Best girl, £2/2/-; best boy, £2/2/-; three next best in each section, each 10/6.
