GRACIE FIELDS, England's greatest comedienne, recently enjoyed one of the greatest days of her life. In the morning she visited the "His Master's Voice" factories at Hayes, Middlesex, to press her own four millionth record. After she had been received by the manager of the record factory, she was conducted to the press on which her latest record to be released by H.M.V. in March—"Play, Fiddle, Play" and "So Long, Lads, We're Off"-was being pressed by one of the workers. The pressman rolled up into a soft ball the warm record material for the four millionth disc. Gracie stepped forward, placed labels on the top and bottom matrices (the metal dies on which her voice and music are engraved), put the ball of record material in the centre of the press and brought the two faces to-She turned a lever to the gether. right, and after the steam had automatically circulated behind the faces of the matrices, followed by water, she lifted the top of the press and withdrew the black, shining disc. which was the four millionth impression of her voice.
