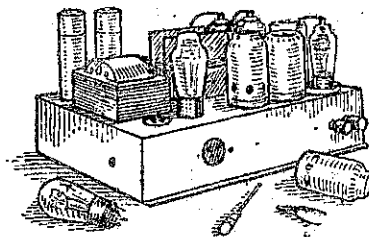
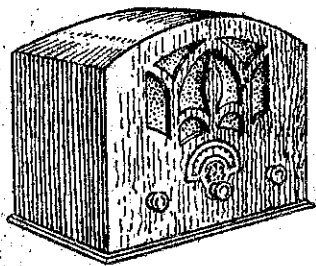

Station WSE— 635 k.c., heard at 8 p.m. on Sunday, September 17, at R3. Request numbers were being played. 5CR was heterodyning. Also a police station, whose call sounded like WRES, on approx. 1600 k.c., at R6, announcing that someone had been injured in a motor-car accident and giving a description of a stolen car. He also mentioned the Detroit Police.—75S (Southland).
