JAPAN has made provision in this year's estimates for a sum exceeding one million yen for the construction of two 500 kilowatt transmitters. New broadcasting stations are also to be erected at Ashigawa, Tokushima, and Magasaki.

AT long last the fiat has gone forth that French listeners must pay a license fee. The Government has decreed that crystal sets will be taxed 15 francs annually and valve sets will be required to pay 50 francs. Representations requesting deferment until after the passing of the broadcasting bill have been met with a deaf ear and now Holland is the only European country where radio listening is to remain free for Portugal also has decided to tax the listener.

FOR two years schools in Ceylon have taken advantage of "Broadcasting Service to Schools" given by Government Broadcasting Department daily between 2 p.m. and 3 p.m., Saturdays and holidays excepted. The experience gained in this country where education is given in three languages, English, Sinhalese and Tamil, indicated the limited possibilities of the development of this service, especially in remote villages and sparsely populated areas.

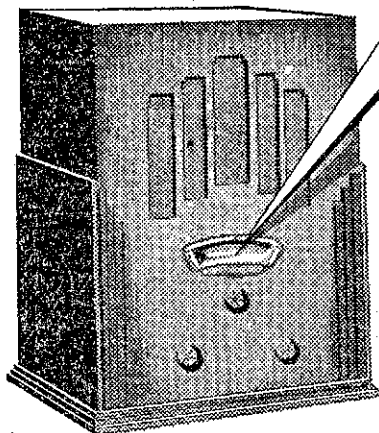

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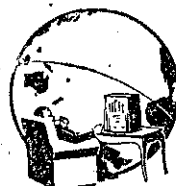
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
