THE possibility that trailing wireless aerials are a danger to aircraft in thunderstorms is suggested by the Air Ministry Orders recently issued. Only 10 cases of British aircraft being struck by lightning have been reported since 1925 and in nearly all instances the craft had a trailing wireless aerial. The Ministry states that when wireless is in use an increase in number or strength of atmospherics would generally indicate that a danger area is being approached. If it is not pos-sible to avoid the area, the aerial should be earthed and wound in.


