Belgian band **Shady Vision** has released a Hardcastle-style single 'Just A Game', about the Heyse stadium riot, which claimed 39 lives. No profits are going to any kind of good cause ... With this summer's PIPs scheme winding down it's time for a pat on the back. The various projects have given full-time employment to members of the city's musical community, in administration, artwork and performance, as well as paying local bands de cent sums to do their stuff. High-lights include the busking competition which saw the **Axmin** storm in, and the recent Aotea Square gig with Bird Nest Roys, Goblin Mix and Pterodactyls. Perhaps the only weakness was a lack of funds for publicising the events themselves. Ta ... and stilt theatre group **Stalker** bowed out of their PIPs scheme with a free Saturday night performance at His

Majesty's. The show began with the by-now familiar comet piece, and went on to introduce some adventurous new material and three new walkers (two women), with backing by Rex Visible, Bevan Sweeney and Robert Key. Cost nothing and delivered heaps. There's a good chance Stalker will carry on without the support of the PIPs payments, but they're now having a short break to rest their tortured spines.

The next few performances will be the last for local faves **Bird Nest Roys** and **Goblin Mix**. The Roys want to try new things and the Gobs have lost bass player Alf to the budget booze and rent of Dunedin ... but the Pterodactyls have picked up ex-Chill Martin Kean on guitar to replace Richard James. First performances most encouraging. Richard, meanwhile, plans to revive the name **Mainly Spaniards** for his new group. If they get famous, Swifty'll be able to tell 'em all about it in the NME ... speaking of which, the **Chills** album *Kaleidoscope World* appears to have peaked at No.3 in the NME Indie Charts. Melody Maker coined the potentially poisonous term 'The Kiwi Beat' in a recently-printed interview with Martin Phillipps ... the **Bats** got safely off to Britain after a wild Tuesday night goo'bye at the Windsor ... and **Tall Dwarfs** and **Fetus Productions** have been invited to play the Am-sterdam Free Festival in May. 
