

Jazz & Blues Festival

British R&B keyboardist Georgie Fame is one of the overseas guests at the fourth Southern Comfort Jazz & Blues festival, which takes place at Auckland's Sheraton hotel over Queen's Birthday weekend. Fame was one of the most influential figures in 60s R&B, having hits such as 'Yeh Yeh' with his band the Blue Flames. Also at the festival will be Ernie Watts, winner of a Grammy in 1985; expatriate NZ pianists Alan Broadbent and Mike Nock, the latter with his Electric Band; Cal Collins, Tom Mason, and from Australia, the Judy Baily Trio. Many of NZ's finest jazz musicians will also perform, including Frank Gibson's Jazzmobile trumpeter Edwina Thorne.

Dr Feelgood Returns

Lee Brilleaux, British rhythm and booze legend, once more makes the trip from Canvey Island to NZ's pub circuit this month. He

plays over 250 gigs a year, and has found time to sign to Stiff Records and release a new album *Brilleaux*. Recorded with Long Ryders producer Will Birch, it includes the single 'See You Later Alligator.' For the past four years the Feelgoods have been Gordon Russell guitar, P H Mitchell bass, and Kevin Morris on drums. Their tour opens May 17 at the Galaxy, winding up in Wellington on May 28.
