**O**Rdered by the Lords and Commons assembled in Parliament, That *Wednesday* next be appointed for a Day of Publique Humiliation, to be observed in all the Parishes and places within the Cities of *London* and *Westminster*, Lines of Communication, and weekly Bills of Mortality. And *Wednesday* next come fortnight to be observed by the whole Kingdom, For the removing of the great Judgment of Rain and Waters now upon the Kingdom, and for preventing the sad Consequences that may insue thereupon.

**O**Rdered by the Commons assembled in Parliament, That the Order for appointing *Wednesday* next come fortnight a Day of publique Humiliation, to be observed throughout the Kingdom, For removing this heavy Judgment of Rain and Waters, and for preventing the sad consequences that may insue thereupon, be forthwith printed; And that the severall and respective Knights and Burgeses of the severall and respective Counties, Cities and Boroughs, do send Copies thereof to the severall and respective Committees; The said Committees are to give timely notice thereof to the severall and respective Ministers, and to take care that the said day may be more strictly observed then many of the former have been.
