ORdered by the Lords and Commons affembled in Parliament, That Wednesday next be appointed for a Day of Publique Humiliation, to be observed in all the Parishes and places within the Cities of London and Westminster, Lines of Communication, and weekly Bills of Mortality. And VVednesday next come fortnight to be observed by the whole Kingdom, For the removing of the great Judgment of Rain and Waters now upon the Kingdom, and for preventing the sad Consequences that may insue thereupon.

Die Jovis, 3. Decemb. 1646.

Redered by the Commons affembled in Parliament, That the Order for appointing Wednesday next come fortnight a Day of publique Flumiliation, to be observed throughout the Kingdom, For removing this heavy Independent of Rain and Waters, and for preventing the sad consequences that may insue thereupon, be forthwith printed; And that the several and respective Knights and Burgesses of the several and respective Counties, (ities and Boroughs, do send Copies thereof to the several and respective Committees; The said Committees are to give timely notice thereof to the several and respective Ministers, and to take care that the said day may be more strictly observed then many of the sormer have been.
