and activities. These include registers of printed books and legal deposit, records relative to members of the Company, bequests, pensions, and charities given by the Company, property owned, and financial records.

Finding aids

A printed guide and inventory accompanies the collection. The contents of each reel are fully described. Indexes for parts of the collection are also included.

## Provenance

The original records are held by the Public Record Office, London. They were microfilmed by the Harvester Press in 1977.

#### Contents

The collection consists of uncalendared State papers relating to the English Civil War and Interregnum and is divided into five parts. Part one illustrates the work of the Parliamentary committees. Parts two, three and four deal with the valuation and disposal of Crown property. Part five contains material relating to the general financial administration of military, civilian and religious affairs during the 1640s and 1650s.

### Provenance

The original records are held in the Public Record Office, London and were microfilmed by the Australian Joint Copying Project. New reels are being added as they arrive.

### Contents

The records comprise: Admiralty and Secretariat. Letters from Offices, 1791-1839 (Adm.1); Miscellanea, 1778-1903 (Adm.7); Masters' logs, 1795-1832, 1837-1871 (Adm.51, 52 and 54); Cases, 1866-1951 (Adm.116) and Navy Board. Records relating to Australia, the Pacific and Southeast Asia, 1766-1796 (Adm.106).

Finding aids

AJCP Handbook, Part 7, indicates the reels held by the Library and there is a descriptive inventory as well.
