The Queen Elizabeth the Second National Trust can help protect forever our precious and enduring land and its features, whether forest, wetland, rivers or lakes. The Trust is an independent body established by Parliament to protect and provide open space; it is not a commercial organisation or a Government department.

An open space covenant is a legal agreement between the Trust and landowners to protect land for a specified time or forever. The owners still own the land: it does not belong to the Government or the Trust. A covenant commits the present and future owners to care for the land wisely, with the Trust as the permanent trustee for its protection. The Trust many also help with management, weed control, fencing and upkeep.

If you have land which you think should be protected, write to the Trust.

Someone from the Trust will look at your land and advise you about open space covenants, at no cost to you. Only the land endures.
