## THEY DELIVERED THE GOODS

Flying boats from Ceylon have carried out one of the most dangerous flights of the war.

They flew 1,200 miles over the India-Burma frontier to the Chindwin, making the first landings there to deliver some important machinery.

The route lay over large tracts of unexplored jungle and the main obstacles was the Chin Hills rising to a height of 8,000 feet.
